- 2. Principal Report Mrs. Koren Clinkscale Report cards go home March 22. On the winter report cards there are no NWEA scores. Parents can reach out to teachers to find out their child's NWEA scores if needed. March is reading: Read the book The Word Collector and it helps us come up a word of the day each day this month. Also, we have had a lot of mystery readers so far this month. March is also Music in the Schools month: Mrs. Berger has hosted our Spring concerts this week. Finally, March is Arts in the Schools month: Ms. Wayne and Ms. Stepnick are placing art all around the school. King has the largest international community in AAPS. That being said, our ELL students are currently taking the WIDA test and they have almost finished completing the test. Mrs. Burgers has been working really hard to get all students tested, so that she may be able to track each student's progress and evaluate what each student's needs are after the test. Also, M STEP is coming up for 3rd-5th grade. We will be testing more towards the middle of April. The 3rd and 4th graders will test on reading and math while the 5th graders will test on math, reading, science, and social studies. Also, The Logo Challenge winner is a 5th grader named Percy. We will share our logo in our Dream Keeper this year. The King Academic Games team did really well. - 3. Teacher Report Mrs. Shah/Mrs. Berger Thank you so much for the delicious hot chocolate bar the messages were so sweet! The teachers were really excited for the Silent Auction and each teacher really talked up their donation beforehand. Ms. Wayne helped digitize the Dream Keeper logo and it has been made into a pin that staff is wearing. Also, from Mr. Tomsik: Kindergarten is doing building/engineer design work

using pushing and pulling. First grade is building a module that investigates light and sound energy. March is Youth Art Month - you may have noticed more art in the halls and a long the front sidewalks and that is thanks to Ms. Wayne and Ms. Stepnick. From Gatonez - Thank you to the PTO for the hard work in organizing the Silent Auction. Parents have been in the classroom for reading and now we are building leprechaun traps. Finally, Mrs. Berger is doing a music showcase where students are invited to share their music talents with fellow students at King.

4. Treasurer Report - Betzy McCarty - Preliminary estimate for Silent Auction is around \$19,000 in funds raised. Restaurant Nights have brought in over \$2,300 this year. \$1,000 over last year's total. This month we received \$550 from the Employer Donor Match Program, Benevity. We have paid out over \$25,000 in enrichment which includes: field trips, mini-grants for our teachers, and staff appreciation program. Thank you to all the teachers for their generous donations to the Silent Auction. We appreciate you! Teacher's Scholastic dollars need to be spent by the end of April. The last day to submit reimbursements for this school year is June 3, 2024.

 - iv. Current revenue is just a few dollars under \$20k
 - v. We surpassed our goal for Cash for Cause and are happy to support this workshop for ELL families
 - vi. Online flash sale begins tonight at 8pm and will end at 8 am on Sunday. This includes several sign up activities that still have spots, plus a new event mom's night out which our PTO board kindly offered to host due to so much demand at the auction.
 - vii. Overall ran remarkably smoothly due to an incredibly dedicated team. It took a lot of people to bring this event to our community and everyone played a key role. There was also a small core team who really kept this ship moving forward and without them we simply wouldn't have pulled it off. We also had extraordinary support from local businesses far beyond anything I expected.
