  - a. Appreciate support and especially per pupil funding
  - b. Disability awareness went well, fourth graders greatly enjoyed it

  - a. More than halfway done with year; but third-way through budget (both expenses and revenue)
  - b. Have brought in \$29,000 so far to date

    - i. 23 King students had a great time at the State tournament in Grand Rapids. Two adventurous teams (upper level) qualified for nationals this year (first time we have had this happen; ten students will participate, event is in Atlanta GA). Our Minor level team (4th grade and under) won two state championships.

    - i. Thursday this week to coincide with Book Fair
    - ii. Very well attended this year, generating revenue

    - i. The Spring Used and New Book Fair is underway. As of Monday afternoon, we have collected just over 4,000 books. The Scholastic book fair is set up and ready to go. Preview day will be Tuesday, the classes will purchase books on Wednesday. The fair will be open to the public on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons from 4-6:30 and during Bagel Thursday from 8:15-9:30. We still need volunteers, especially during the after school hours.

Special Education Millage Proposal for May, Jen to review key points; special education services provided for approximately 11% of AAPS students; these are required to be provided regarded of funding source; AAPS provides support for K-12; so this millage provides funds across the board, for all schools and students; this would free up funds from general funds
