3. Treasurer Report - Betzy McCarty - Total income \$64,000 at end of April. Bulk of Income coming from Silent Auction, Restaurant Nights, and Ann Arbor PTO Thrift. Total expenses were around \$3,350.
4. Principal Report - Mrs. Clinkscale - Thank you to the PTO for all of the lunch last week! We all felt appreciated and loved. The 5th grade concert was absolutely lovely. It's so nice to see the growth in our students. We are also in the midst of our NWEA testing. We did have our students receive an invitation for the testing out of 6th grade math. They did their test today and if they do well they can take the test next week. We are doing a locker clean out and lost and found clean out coming up. We will let families know when that will take place. Also, I just wanted to announce that Mr. Huyck is retiring after this year. He is firm in his decision and excited for this new chapter of his life. He is so grateful for all the support from the King community.

- a. Silent Auction update - Sara Hammerschmidt -
 - i. Raised nearly \$23k in revenue from the auction (including wine pull, raffle baskets, and online post-auction sales)
 - ii. Raised an additional \$995 for a new King Library book binder (Cash for a Cause)
 - iii. We had about 130 families attend the auction
 - iv. We had incredible volunteers - both new and "seasoned" - that were key to the overall success of the auction
